GAINS FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS, PROMOTORAS, AND REPRESENTATIVES

The California Community Health Worker, Promotora, and Representative Policy Coalition unveiled <u>The People's Agenda:</u> <u>Planting Seeds for a Healthy Tomorrow</u>, which provided 15 policy priority recommendations to ensure equity and sustainability for CHW/P/Rs and improves care for marginalized communities. CPEHN was invited to testify before the Legislature and share these recommendations, ultimately resulting in a state budget investment for CHW/P/Rs.





COMMUNITY ADVOCACY RESULTS IN LEGISLATIVE SUCCESS



CPEHN proudly supported numerous equity-focused and community-based legislative efforts aimed at addressing the systemic barriers faced by our most impacted communities. The Having Our Say Advocacy Day included 61 legislative visits to advocate for these priorities. 19 bills were successfully signed into law, marking a significant step toward improving health outcomes and advancing justice for historically underserved populations. This progress reflects CPEHN's unwavering commitment to creating a healthier and more equitable California.



CPEHN's sponsored bill, AB 3161 (Bonta), was signed into law, requiring hospitals to acknowledge and address the role of racism in adverse patient safety events like medication errors and negative birth outcomes. We are grateful to Assembly Health Committee Chair Mia Bonta and Black Women for Wellness Action Project for their leadership on this effort.



BUILDING COMMUNITY RESILIENCE THROUGH COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS

In partnership with Disability Rights California (DRC) and in collaboration with Decarcerate Sacramento, Transitions-Mental Health Association (T-MHA), The Center for Sexuality and Gender Diversity (The Center), the Ryse Center, and



Vision y Compromiso (VyC), we hosted nine community conversations across California. These conversations focused on discussing the current mental health landscape, recent policies such as SB 43, CARE Court, and Proposition 1, and their impacts on communities of color and individuals with disabilities. Participants engaged in dialogue to share reactions, voice concerns, and strategize with regional community organizations and members on preserving and advancing community care.
